

Pupil Premium Report 2014-15

Delph Primary School is committed to providing the best possible opportunities for all children regardless of their circumstances.

In 2014-15, our school was allocated £14,300. This funding was spent as follows:

Impact:

- Feedback from the Study Support Programme (April 2015) highlighted pupils high attendance and a 20% improvement was made on entry/exit test by almost all pupils in the areas of ICT, Literacy, Numeracy & Sport. Learners were enthusiastic and motivated on all activities.
- Our Learning & Nurture Mentor has worked to support numerous children & families
- The impact of the funding has enabled the school to begin to close the academic gap between disadvantaged and other pupils.
- End of year school tracking shows that pupil premium children made very good progress; almost all meeting or exceeding year group expectations in 2014-15.
- All pupils were able to take full advantage of the numerous trips, visits, extra-curricular provision and Y5 & 6 residential in 2014-15.
- Y5/6 pupils benefitted from expert MFL provision provided by a language teacher from Saddleworth High School. This has also aided transition.
